How to Become a Social Worker: A Quick Guide

1. Earn a bachelor's degree in social work.
2. Earn a master's degree in social work. Whether you received your bachelor's degree in social work...
3. Make the most of your time in school. Choose courses and consider specialized certifications...
4. ...Bachelor's Degree in Social Work. A bachelor's degree in social work is the field's minimum credential. Social work bachelor's programs provide a comprehensive overview of the field. Students typically learn about case management, community and program organization, and utilizing community resources. The next step after becoming a licensed social worker is to become an LMSW. If you hold a master's degree in social work and pass the ASWB exam, you'll be eligible to apply for a LMSW license from your state. LMSW's tend to work in case management for children or people seeking public assistance.

Many jobs require a Master's Degree in Social Work (M.S.W.), which students who already have a bachelor's can usually earn in two years. If you want to do therapy, you will need an M.S.W. Students at this level take more advanced courses that focus on their areas of concentration. Becoming a social worker requires either a bachelor's degree or a master's degree depending on the level of social service and state licensure for those in clinical or school settings. As a social worker you can work in a variety of settings such as local authorities, NHS Trusts or the voluntary or private sectors with a diverse client base including children, adults, the elderly, families and those with disabilities, addictions, learning difficulties and mental health issues. Qualifications and experience. Social workers must have a degree in social work (BA), or master's degree in social work. A master's degree is a two-year-long postgraduate course for those with a degree in a different subject. Some universities offer part-time studying. Experience is an important part of social work qualifications.

Bachelor of Social Work (BSW)

In the state of California, the lowest level of education required to become a social worker is a bachelor's degree in social work (BSW). If you plan to take this path, choose a college or university with a Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) accredited bachelor of social work program. It's possible to do a degree in social work and learning disabilities nursing. You'll need to check that the course is recognised by the relevant professional bodies.
